You can be **fined** for taking your child on holiday during term time, or if your child has a number of unauthorised absences.

Schools have to inform the local authority of any pupils who are regularly absent from school, have irregular attendance, or have missed 5 school days or more without the school's permission.

Schools are also under a safeguarding duty, to investigate and report any unexplained absences.

Fine - Your local council can give you a fine of £60, which rises to £120 if you don't pay within 21 days. If you don't pay the fine after 28 days you may be prosecuted for your child's absence from school.

Prosecution - You could get a fine of up to £2,500, a community order or a jail sentence up to 3 months. The court also gives you a Parenting Order. This means you have to go to parenting classes. You'll also have to do what the court says to improve your child's school attendance.

Please remember to contact the school office each day of illness to advise that your child will not be in school.

### Live.me

Northamptonshire Police would like to bring to the attention of parents the app 'Live.me'. This is a live video streaming app where users can broadcast live-streaming videos and watch others' videos. The terms of use specify that users must be 18 years of age or have parental permission to use the tool.

The app has limited security features and it is possible for users to potentially identify the location where a video was recorded. It is possible for any video to be recorded and shared without the permission or knowledge of the person who made the video.


We would encourage parents to make sure they know what apps their child is using, how each app works and what their child is using it for.




